2022-23 dates sheet

You have already been sent the dates sheet for 2022-23 so please ensure you are aware of events that are happening in school. Uniform

Children have returned to school looking very smart in their uniform – many thanks for your support with this. It has been noted, however, that the school uniform supplier is taking a long time to fulfil orders. Please be aware that our policy does not stipulate that children have to wear the uniform with logos on it. Plain items of clothing in the correct colour are acceptable. It does, however, stagger and baffle me as to how much uniform does not have a name in it and we have a huge amount that is not claimed, totalling hundreds of pounds! **Please ensure all uniform has a name written in it.** This also includes water bottles (containing water, not juice) and lunch boxes etc.

Please can I remind everyone that children should only wear stud earrings in school, no hoops, and that trainers are not permitted.

Home learning

Home learning for Term 1 has been sent out to you with details of the tasks that your children are expected to complete in the order of their choice. We shall, this term, be looking more closely at who is and is not completing learning as it is important that we celebrate and recognise the efforts children make. Please encourage children to complete their tasks, along with TT Rock Stars and reading every day (with a parent signing and commenting in the reading record to evidence this). Please speak to your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns about home learning.

It is great to see children coming into school at the new time of 8:45am in time for the gates to close at 8:50am. Once again, I thank you for your efforts with this. This year we shall be monitoring attendance more closely, and I must remind you that holiday requests cannot be authorised unless there are very specific circumstances in line with our policy. Please note that having good attendance is not a criteria for authorising a holiday request and unauthorised absence may lead to the issuing of a penalty notice. 

School Vision

Our children demonstrate a wealth of positive behaviours on a daily basis, and our behaviour policy recognises this. We believe it is important to notice, encourage and acknowledge the good stuff! We have now introduced 'Shiny Tickets' which children can earn if they are 'caught' doing something kind or caring, helpful or polite or something demonstrating our values. A shiny ticket goes into a weekly draw and one winner is chosen and they receive several little prizes! All tickets are kept and will go into a final year prize draw in July 2023!

Junior Leadership

This year we are planning to further develop leadership roles across the school for our pupils. On Friday 16th September we heard a wonderful selection of speeches from Year 6 pupils putting themselves forward as potential House Captains. I was so impressed with the effort they had taken with their speeches and the recognition of the qualities needed to be a good leader. We shall announce the winners very soon, but I would like to commend all children that stood in front of the whole school and presented their case – well done!

We shall also be appointing a Head Boy and Head Girl, Prefects, School Council and Eco Council members, and Leading Lights.

Playground development

As part of our curriculum offer we are looking at playground activities and have begun to introduce a wider range of resources for children to play with at lunchtimes, so that they have a variety of physical activity to choose from. We are awaiting some picnic tables so that we can continue to develop the area at the top of the playground as a quiet zone for children that would like to do something less noisy and active.



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Many children are currently bringing Pokemon cards in from home to play with when in the playground and this is currently working well. It is important that everyone is aware that if problems do occur as a result of these then we may have to reconsider them coming into school, however at the moment the children are really enjoying their social time with them!

We are looking to continue to develop the area with the pergola and will be installing seating so that it can be used as an outdoor reflective space.
