## Key Dates

22 June 1948: The liner 'SS Empire Windrush' docked at Tilbury carrying nearly 500 Caribbean immigrants to Britain, many attracted by offers of work.

5 July 1948: The National Health Service, established by the post war Labour government.

6 February 1952: Elizabeth II succeeds her father, George VI. Princess Elizabeth was in Kenya when news of her fathers death reached her. She immediately returned to Britain and was crowned on 2nd June 1953.

1952- The first jet aeroplane to carry passengers, called Comet, began to run a regular passenger service.

1955: Disneyland opens

1957: Elvis Presley has his first UK number 1

1960: Lego comes to Britain

1961 The Berlin wall is built; physically separating
Russian controlled East Berlin from the Allied controlled
Western section.

22 November 1963: John F Kennedy is assassinated while riding with his wife Jaqueline in a presidential motorcade.

1962- The first computer video game, Spacewar, is invented.

1963: Martin Luther King give "I have a dream" speech

1966 - England won the football World cup

21 July 1969: American astronaut Neil Armstrong becomes the first man to set foot on the moon



Neil Armstrong was an American Astronaut and engineer he became the first man to walk on the Moon.

Martin Luther King Jr. was an American Christian minister and activist who became the most visible spokesperson and leader in the Civil Rights Movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968.
