Year R Expressive Arts & Design	By the end of EYFS our children will be able to.... <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Experiment with mixing colours.• Invent and construct using a variety of materials.• Use and explore simple tools appropriately (scissors, hold paintbrush correctly)• Talk about ideas and explain choices in learning.• Combine different media to produce a final piece.• Experiment with texture.
Key Stage 1	By the end of Key Stage 1 our children will be able to.... <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Cut, glue and trim a variety of material.• Experiment with making marks in print.• Mix paint showing shade.• Create structures by joining materials together (3D materials)• Use a variety of tools to draw lines (pencil, pen, crayon, chalk)• Cut, shape and join fabric (tie knots, thread, treasury tags, paper clips etc)• Evaluate creative work of others.• Be able to name the materials being used.• Use different grades of pencil.• Use chalk and charcoal to experiment with tone.• Be able to explain tone.• Join fabrics (running stitch)• Mix secondary colours from primary colours and use the language of art to talk about this. (poster paint).• Show tone in pieces of artwork.• Use a viewfinder.• Create a work of art using different sketching techniques.• Use variety of printing techniques (carving, stamping, rolling)• Create textured collage using crumpling and tearing techniques.• Know about the work of Rousseau.• Know about the work of Frida Kahlo.



Lower Key Stage 2

By the end of Lower Key Stage 2 our children will be able to....

- Experiment with a range of brushes.
- Create works of art using watercolour paint.
- Evaluate and analyse their work, explaining what they like/dislike.
- Experiment with warm and cold colours.
- Be able to explain warm and cold colours.
- Experiment with clay and use techniques to shape and mould.
- Comment on the work of a sculptor.
- Show shading using different media.
- Think critically about work from other cultures.
- Invent sculpture with natural and recycled materials.
- Know about the work of Andy Goldsworthy.
- Sketch showing familiar proportions.
- Know about the work of Turner.
- Use water colour paint techniques such as washes and bleeds.
- Experiment with creating mood in works of art.
- Use the language of art, craft and design to describe artist techniques.
- Know about the work of Andy Warhol.

Upper Key Stage 2

By the end of Upper Key Stage 2 our children will be able to....

- Explain choices of materials and techniques used for own piece of work.
- Create effective foreground and background.
- Know about the work of Van Gogh.
- Create movement in art work.
- Create work over longer periods of time.
- Understand and be able to explain historical art forms (Mayan)
- Use tone and shading in three dimension.
- Know about the work of Constable.
- Analyse creative works and explain why techniques have been used.
- Experiment with scale.
- Know about the work of William Morris.
- Experiment with painting techniques for different parts of a piece eg stippling, brush strokes.
- Create intricate printing patterns. (lino)
- Use the language of art when evaluating.
- Evaluate sculpture pieces and know about the sculpture of chosen artists. (Henry Moore/Barbara Hepworth)
