



Terrific Tales!

What can you see? What can you hear? What can you smell? Is it very busy or very quiet? Are you able to touch things?</p> <p>Draw a picture to show your setting.</p>
<p>Maths <u>Position and Direction.</u></p> <p>Children to give directions to a family member, to something or somewhere in their home.</p> <p>Children are to use directional language Such as: LEFT, RIGHT, FORWARD, BACKWARDS, TURN CLOCKWISE OR ANTI CLOCKWISE, HALF, QUARTER OR WHOLE TURNS.</p> <p>Children will be learning this vocabulary the first week back.</p> <p>Have a practise first and if they are amazing then let them guide you whilst you have your eyes closed or blindfolded.</p>	<p>DT <u>Make your own Terrific Tale puppet.</u></p> <p>Create a character and using any material you have at home make a puppet.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>Draw and plan what your perfect character for your brand-new Terrific Tale would look like.</p> <p>What would they wear?</p> <p>What colour hair would they have?</p> <p>Are they a mythical creature?</p> 	<p>Computing</p> <p>Log on to Timetables Rockstars. Log ins for this should be in the front of your child's reading record.</p> <p>Times table rockstars is a brilliant tool to use to increase children's multiplication skills.
