Traditional Tales Term Curriculum

Maths: Our focus for this term is numbers beyond 20. We will be learning the numbers from 10 to 20 including the number bonds.

RE: Our topic for this term is 'What can we learn from Old Testament stories?'. We will be learning about why stories are special to people and the faiths around the world.

Reading: We will continue to change books weekly. It is important that the children are reading each week at home, and it is being recorded in their reading record books.

Reading is important for developing children's phonics and helps them to build important language skills.

Writing: Each child's handwriting has come on amazingly! We will continue to practise our letter formation and we are beginning to write short sentences in Literacy.
