Children in Acorn Class should be dropped off at the reception outdoor area gate in the morning. After school children will be brought out of the reception area gate to be dismissed in front of the sheds.

Outdoor curriculum The outdoor area is an important part of our classroom and as such the children will be using it for their learning in all weathers. Please ensure that they come to school dressed appropriately for any weather. You may wish to leave some wellies and puddle suit in a names bag just incase.



We love to get messy, and as such accidents may happen. Please bring in a spare set of **named** clothes in a draw string or carrier bag so that we can change your child's clothes if necessary. **Please make sure all items of clothes, including coats, are labelled with your child's name.**

Please ensure your child has these items in school every day:

- Book bag
- Reading record and book (these will be changed weekly and eventually twice weekly as their reading progresses)
- Spare pair of clothes, underwear and socks – **all items to be labelled with their name**
- Weather proof clothing (especially as the weather changes)

How you can help

- Read to your child and discuss books every day. Record this in their reading record. This does not always need to be the book sent home from the school.
- When reading focus each day on a different skill: decoding, copying expression and comprehension questions.
- Develop counting skills and play number games.
